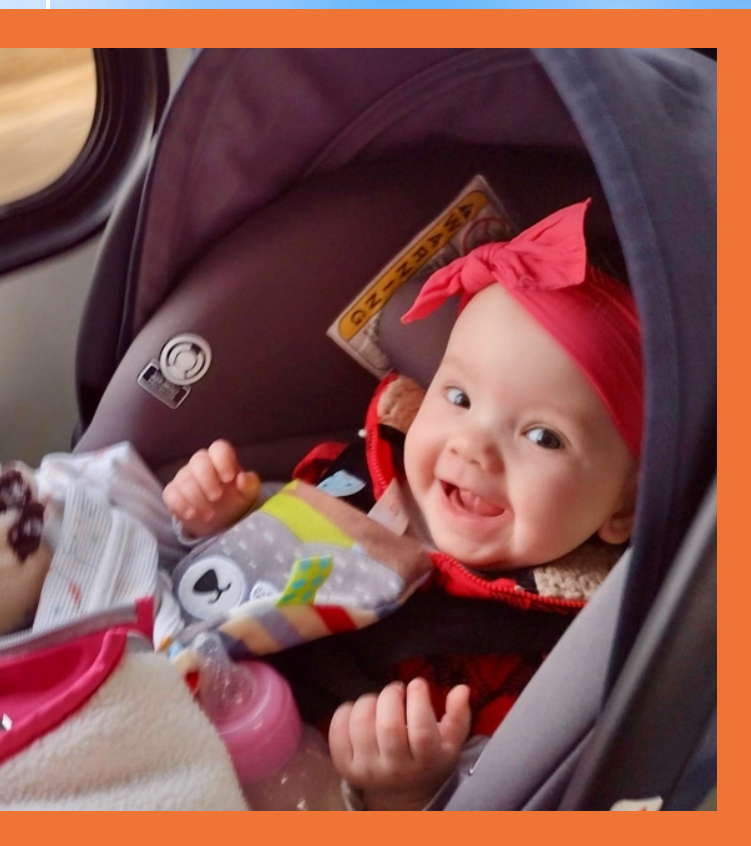

MISSION STATEMENT:

To connect families to resources and community by providing reliable transportation for seriously ill children and pregnant women to essential healthcare.

Seventy percent of the children who use the Lansing area subspecialty clinics are on Medicaid and are missing up to 60% of their doctor appointments, often because they do not have a reasonable way of getting there. Since each appointment is essential for monitoring a child's condition and keeping him or her as healthy as possible (and out of the hospital), The Davies Project's first goal is to help families by giving them volunteer-provided rides to primarily Lansing area medical appointments.

The Davies Project provides rides to all of a child's medical appointments. This includes all specialty appointments, physical therapy, occupational therapy, mental health care, dental and eye visits, and primary care. We also provide rides to prenatal visits for pregnant women, and to the neonatal intensive care unit (NICU) for parents of hospitalized infants.

Every activity supports the healthiest outcomes possible for our community's children.

Message from our Founder & Executive Director



Dear Friends,

2022 was a banner year at The Davies Project!

Even with our doors closed early in the year due to COVID, the average number of rides per month jumped from 137 in 2021 to 183 in 2022. As word spreads, more and more families in need are reaching out to us for help.

Yet, because volunteerism has not fully rebounded since the pandemic, we have had to start a waiting list for services—something we had hoped to never do. Our team is doing all it can to fill every ride, though, and our 40 active drivers are going above and beyond to meet the demand as best they can.

We know there are willing volunteers out there and we are working hard to let them know about us. We just need our strategy to gain some traction! Any recommendations you might have for groups or individuals to speak with would be greatly appreciated. I love the opportunity to speak about our agency with others. Please reach out if you feel you can be of help personally or with introductions.

The beauty of being eight years into our mission is that we have now been working with many families for almost as long. Hundreds of infants have been born healthier—and have healthier moms—thanks to their moms' ability to access prenatal care through The Davies Project. Many of our children are living in more secure homes because parents are better able to hold down jobs when their children's health is closely monitored and stable.

By providing additional resources and transportation to every kind of medical appointment, The Davies Project helps to dampen the snowball effect that can so quickly upend a family when a child grows sicker due to missed care.

Just last week, we had an arts and crafts event at what we warmly refer to as 'The Firehouse'. Several families attended as a way to meet one another and do something fun together. I especially remember two brothers, both of whom are on the autism spectrum (now more accurately referred to as neurodiversity). They were so excited to be here, especially the older boy. When his mom heard him talking to me, she turned and said, "My older son never talks!" Yet the camaraderie inspired by the agency and the hope it gives to the people it serves is manifested in this simple statement.

Hope matters. Relationships matter.
Caring matters. Volunteering matters.

I am proud of what we are accomplishing at The Davies Project, particularly the hope that is inspired through the simple act of neighbors helping neighbors.

Thank you for joining me on this journey.

What we do matters—a lot.

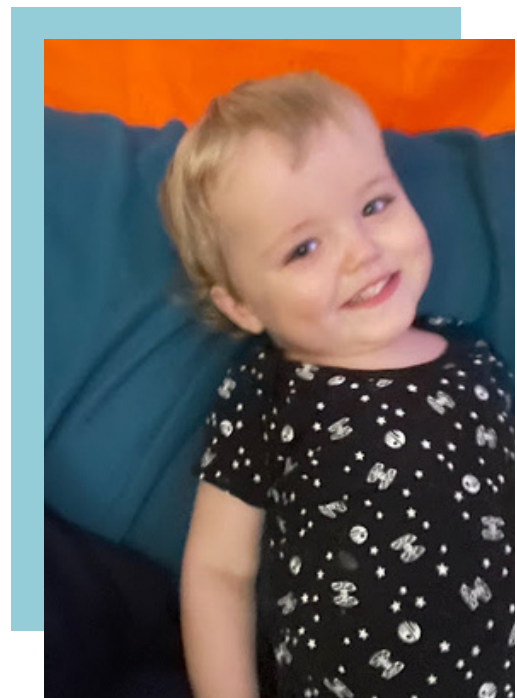

I think The Davies Project is such a wonderful organization.

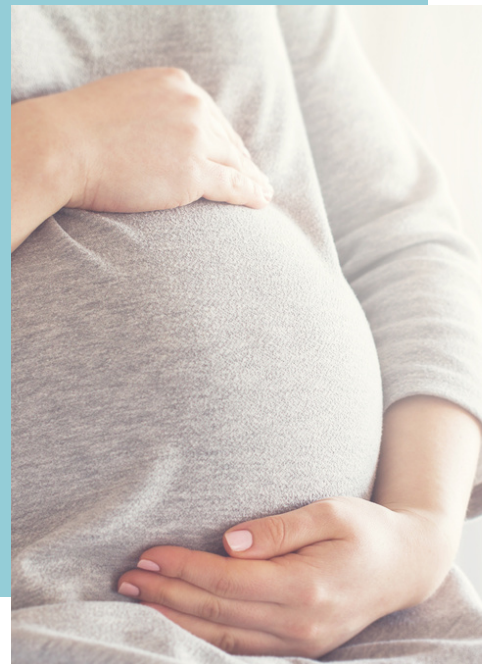

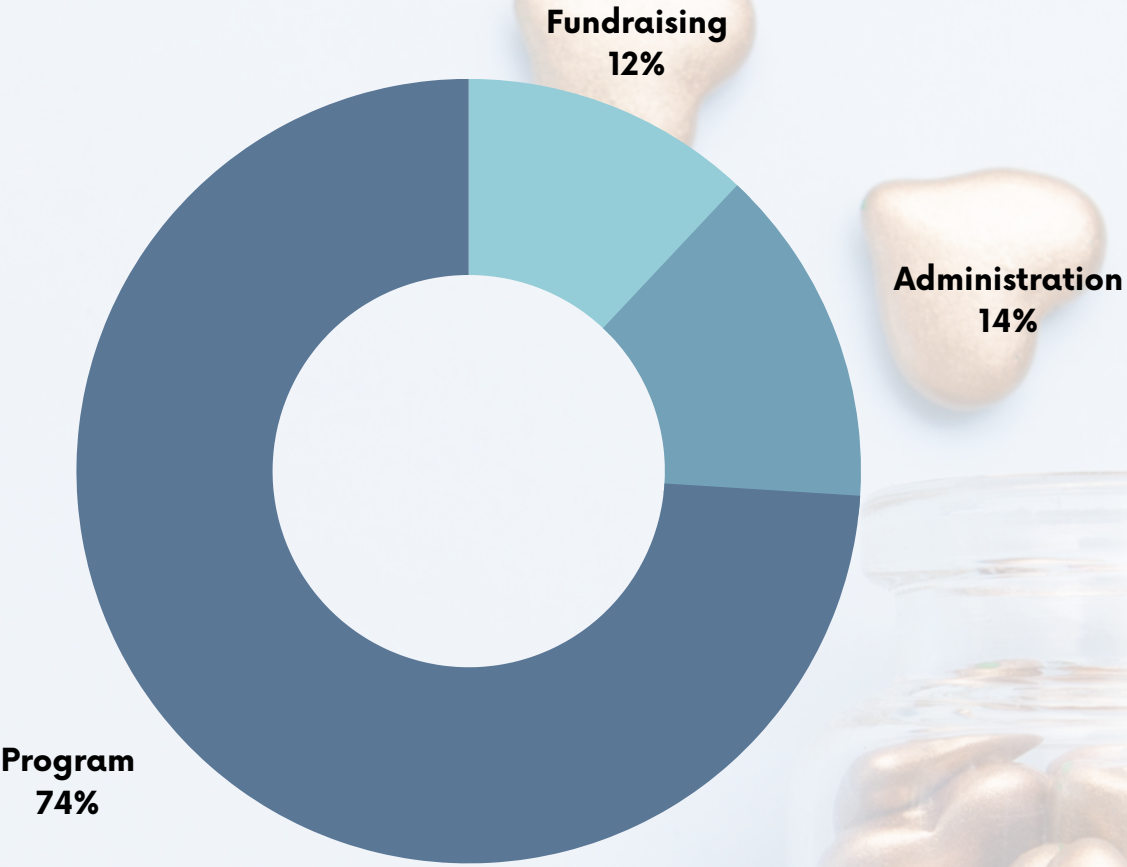
Hear from Thany, prenatal mother

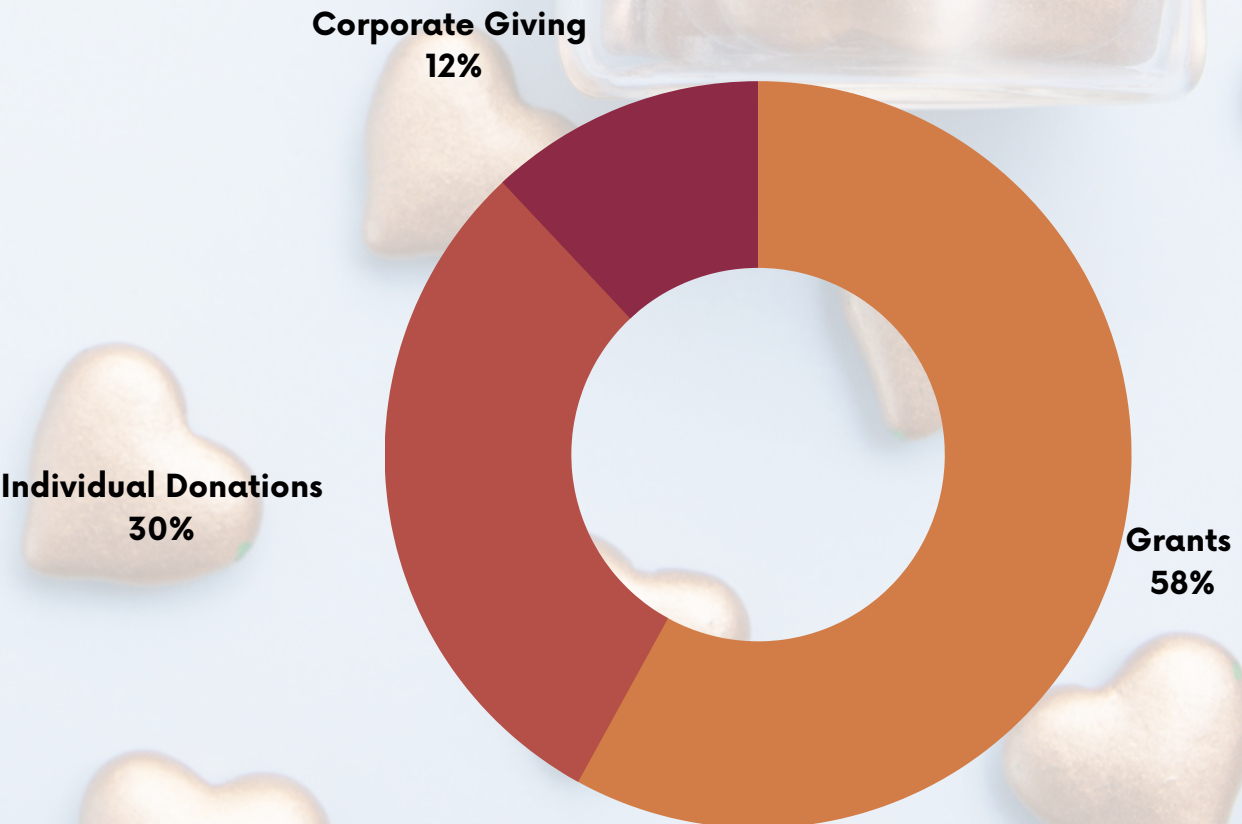
